FUTURE PHILANTHROPISTS PROGRAM

Request for Proposals

Submission Deadline: Friday, January 6, 2017 at 6:00 PM

The Future Philanthropists Program (FPP) is comprised of a select group of high school juniors who are engaged directly in the important role of community philanthropy. The purpose of FPP is to provide an intensive, year-long, hands-on learning experience through which they are taught the art and science of grant making. They are solely responsible for making funding recommendations, subject only to the approval of the Board of Directors of the Oak Park-River Forest Community Foundation.

FPP is once again seeking proposals from eligible tax-exempt organizations in Oak Park, River Forest and bordering communities including Austin. Grant funds may be used to expand existing programs or initiate new projects. A total of \$25,000 in grants will be awarded in this cycle. The maximum single grant award is \$5,000.

Primary Program Requirements

In order to be considered, the proposal must demonstrate that the following requirements are met:

1. Young people (under 21 years of age) directly benefit from the program or project.
2. Young people are provided with leadership opportunities in planning, organizing and/or delivering the proposed program or project.
3. A learning component exists, beyond the project itself, which provides young people with specific knowledge about the purpose and activities of your organization.

Eligibility Guidelines

All applicant organizations must:

1. Be recognized by the IRS as a 501(c)(3) organization (or have a fiscal agent who is).
2. Affirm that the program or project will be completed prior to March 1, 2018.
3. Show evidence, if a past Community Foundation grant recipient, that all prior grant reporting requirements have been met.

Note: An organization that has previously received two or more consecutive-year grants from FPP for the same program or project is ineligible. However, an organization that requests funding for a different program or project is eligible.



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GUIDELINES FOR WRITING A PROPOSAL

All applicant organizations must complete and submit the 1) Executive Summary Page, 2) Proposal Narrative and 3) Project Budget, in that order. Proposals will be accepted only in electronic format as an attachment to an email sent to Karen Tardy, Program Coordinator, at fpp@oprpcf.org. Deadline for submission is **January 6, 2017 at 6:00 PM**. Please use the following outline in writing your Proposal Narrative.

- (6) Over what timeframe, beginning to end, will the program occur?
- (7) What is your expected impact and how will the program be evaluated?
- (8) What is the background of the person responsible for the program?

Do not include any other materials with your proposal
