Creating a Legacy

Have you thought about what your legacy will be? Ours is represented in our vision for a vibrant, sustainable, and caring community.

We are building our legacy in a variety of ways.

- We've increased participation in opportunities to collectively give through our giving groups:
 - Our Women Leaders in Philanthropy annually chooses causes to support. In 2016 the causes were mental illness and suicide prevention, arts engagement for our youth, and activity fees for underserved youth.
 - NextGen Leaders in Philanthropy offer Happy Hour Helps for members to gather, learn about philanthropic opportunities, and collectively give for impact. In 2016, they provided a \$2,000 grant to Parenthesis for parent education programs.
 - Entrepreneur Leaders in Philanthropy give area entrepreneurs an opportunity to leverage contributions into a \$50.000 grant for a Big Idea that will transform our community. The 2016 Big Idea Pitch winner, The Surplus Project, takes excess food and creates meals for food insecure individuals.
- We're helping local social impact organizations through Impact Excellence seminars, senior executive roundtables, and technical assistance services.
- We're teaching high school students the art and skill of grant making and fundraising through the Future Philanthropists Program. Juniors distribute \$25,000; seniors in 2016 raised \$68,000 for the FPP endowment.
- We're reimagining our leadership by crafting the Community Leadership Program into Leadership Lab – a program for citizens to develop skills, knowledge, and abilities to become more effective and engaged community leaders.


