

Cassin-Germanson Rotary Fund Grant



Background: The Cassin-Germanson Rotary Fund was established by the Rotary Club of Oak Park-River Forest with the Oak Park-River Forest Community Foundation, a tax-exempt 501(c)3 organization, in 2020 to honor the memory of two of its most dynamic female members. Virginia (Ginie) Cassin was the first female admitted to the Rotary Club of Oak Park-River Forest in 1988 and was recognized throughout the Village for her charm, an upbeat can-do attitude and her skillful persuasiveness. Sister Michelle Germanson, O.P. joined Rotary in 1992 while serving as the President of Trinity High School. She was known for her determination, her energetic spirit and her keen sense of humor. The Rotary Club of Oak Park-River Forest seeks to honor the legacy of these two women by providing an opportunity for young female students, grades 6-8, to explore areas of learning outside of their classroom that will help each girl form their talents, interest and vision of self, who, without financial assistance, would be unable to have this opportunity. Areas of learning and exploration include multiple categories such as arts, sciences, sports and humanities.

Description: Amounts: up to \$600. This grant fund was established by the Rotary Club of Oak Park-River Forest to help female middle school students to attend specialized programs to develop areas of personal interest. This fund specifically looks to support females, grades 6-8th, explore an emerging interest in hopes of being able to give them valuable experience, education, and guidance as they transition to high school and eventually college and/or career.

Selection Criteria:

- Letter of Recommendation from referring agency, organization, school or other community partner to include why the student is deserving and what a grant award could mean to them
- Paragraph from the student applicant sharing why they picked the avenue they wish to pursue and what having this opportunity will mean to them. It should include the name of the program/area of interest/study, as well as the dates and times
- Meets eligibility requirements
- Demonstrates financial need
- Applications will be reviewed by, and grants awarded by, members of the Cassin-Germanson Rotary Fund committee

Application Process:

- Applications are due: March 1st for April grants and August 1st for September grants
