



WOMEN LEADERS IN PHILANTHROPY FUND

2021 Causes

- Provide mental health care such as counseling, trauma services and wellness education to first responders, essential workers and others who are unable to afford care or for whom stigma has been a barrier to treatment.
GRANTEE: Proviso Partners for Health (True You racial healing), Smart Love Family Services (minority family program), Thrive Counseling Center (mental health services for LGBTQ+ youth and people of color)
- Support local programs which combat systemic racism within our community, for example, within education, housing, the criminal justice system, and/or other domains.
GRANTEE: Addressed by grantees across all the causes with emphasis given to groups which considered and amplified voices of color.
- Address food insecurity needs in all populations; note student population and youth/senior populations have been specifically targeted in the past.
GRANTEE: Beyond Hunger (home delivery program in Austin), Quinn Center of St. Eulalia (hunger ministry in Maywood)
- Support housing assistance for low-income and vulnerable populations; support is to be offered to housing support networks and not directly to families in need.
GRANTEE: SisterHouse (residential and behavioral health)

2020 Causes

- Address food insecurity needs in the student and senior populations.
GRANTEE: Quinn Center of St. Eulalia's Hunger Ministry for Maywood; Beyond Hunger's Direct Hunger Assistance for Seniors and Children
- Connect seniors, adults and youth with counseling and support networks for mental health promotion and suicide prevention.
GRANTEE: NAMI's Support 4U texting program; Thrive Counseling Center's Suicide Risk Prevention for Suicide Risk in Hard-to-Reach Populations
- Support programs which promote positive mental health and encourage community engagement, especially intergenerational relationships, for older adults, thereby reducing social isolation among older adults.
GRANTEE: Senior Services of Oak Park and River Forest's Creating Connectedness Project

2019 Causes

- Support programs which prepare teens and young adults to enter the workforce, focusing on financial literacy and workplace behavior.
GRANTEE: New Moms' job training program, YEMBA's mentoring empowerment training
- Support efforts to recruit, train and support leaders of color in local schools, non-profits, government and other institutions.
GRANTEE: Collaboration for Early Childhood's parent leadership training
- Connect adults and youth with education, counseling and support networks for mental health promotion and suicide prevention.
